Wayne Conservation District Seedling Sale Descriptions

White Spruce Seedlings - Grows to 50 feet. Stiff needles are light bluish-green, usually less than 1 inch in length. This spruce thrives in well drained or moist soil. This tree is unique because it can endure heat and drought better than others. They are being sold as 10-18" seedlings in several package sizes.

Douglas Fir Transplants - Grows to 60 feet. The Douglas has soft blue-green needles. It does not do well in heavy wet clay soils. Select a site that is on a slope with better drainage. It is an excellent choice for Christmas Trees. These transplants are sold 3 to a package and are 18-24" tall.

Norway Spruce Transplants – Faster growth to 80 feet. Spread 35 to 40 feet. It does well in average soil conditions. With its drooping branches it makes an excellent windbreak or shelter. They are being sold as 18-24" transplants, 3 to a package.

Red Oak – Grows to a height of 75 feet. Prefers moist rich soil. The acorns provide food for wildlife and the leaves turn red in autumn and will hang on the tree through the winter months. This fast growing Oak matures with a broad round canopy. They are being sold as 18-24" seedlings 2 per package.

American Hazelnut – Also known as American Filbert. The Hazelnut is a multi-stemmed small tree that will grow to a height of 10 to 15'. This species prefers full sun, but will tolerate some shade. The fruit is edible but smaller than some cultivated species of filberts. The fruit is eaten by many wildlife species including deer, pheasant, turkey and squirrels. The fruit matures September to October. They are being offered two per package as 12-15" seedlings.

Spicebush - This 5-20 feet tall, spreading bush is a native member of the laurel family and is deer resistant. The bushes are usually colonial, spreading by the roots. Crush or scratch the thin, brittle twigs, or any part of the spicebush to release its lemony-spicy fragrance. The bright green leaves turn yellow-gold in the fall. The spicebush is one of the first to blossom in the spring with small yellow flowers. The small red fruit may be used as spice for many recipes. The fruit is also eaten by many bird species. It grows best in partial shade in moderate to well-drained soil. It is being sold as 12-18" seedlings, 5 per package.

Forsythia - Very fast, upright growth to 7 feet; spread of 5 feet. One of the best plants for fast flowering screen. Deep golden flowers, early spring, more thickly and evenly distributed along the stems than other Forsythia. Ordinary to poor soil. This plant can easily be pruned, after blooming, to maintain desired height and will bloom better next year. Sold as 15-18" plants

Blueberry – We are offering 1 Bluecrop and 1 Blueray in this package. Both are midseason varieties. They are winter hardy with dark blue high quality fruit. They prefer slightly acidic soil and tolerate shade. They are 14 to 16" tall.

Peach Tree – Contender is the variety being offered this year. It is a high quality, freestone variety with yellow flesh. Fruit is very firm and large. The trees are hardy and very productive.. Select a site with full sun and good drainage. They are 4-5' tall.

Apple Trees – We are offering two varieties in this year's package, Ginger Gold and Nittany. The Ginger Gold is a very popular green or yellow apple. It should ripen in mid to late August. The fruit is crisp and mildly tart. The Nittany apple is orange red with yellow flesh that oxidizes slowly. It is good fresh or processed and stores well. These trees are 4-5' tall. Select a site that is well drained and in full sun.

Tree Shelters – 5' high tubes that offer newly planted seedlings protection from deer & rabbits. We have upgraded to the taller tube for greater protection. They work well with most deciduous (leafed) trees. Shelters are not recommended for fruit trees due to their branching habit. Includes: 5' shelter, fiberglass stake and bird net.

Tree Mats – These 3' by 3' mats are for protecting new seedlings from weed competition and moisture loss. They may be used with shelters and covered with mulch.

Bluebird Boxes –These nesting boxes are for rearing the young birds. The boxes are made of rough-cut Pine.
