Hello! We hope that you are doing well and want everyone to know that we have missed you and can't wait until we can be together again.

We know that this has been a difficult time and have been happy to be able to stay connected with some of you through phone calls, drive-thru and Facebook exercise classes!

We are in the process of preparing a plan to resume activities at our Centers with a target date of 6/29/2020. At that time, meals and activities will resume on a limited basis and reservations will be required by 1pm on the prior business day. This will be strictly enforced.

We will not be able offer all of our previous activities at this time. A schedule will be released at a later date.

Until further notice, we will continue to offer take-out meals at all 3 centers (11am-12pm with reservation by 1pm on the prior business day), Facebook Live Chair Exercise (Mondays, 9am), and check-in calls (weekly or biweekly) for those who would prefer this method of participation.

As we move into the next phase – we want you to be aware of the new protocols in place to keep our participants, volunteers, and staff safe. Please review our new guidelines, sign the acknowledgement and complete a brief survey prior to returning to the center.


These guidelines will be closely adhered to and if you are unable to comply, you will be asked to leave. It is our goal that our Centers are safe and comfortable for all of our participants.


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


SENIOR CENTER GUIDELINES EFFECTIVE 6/29/2020

- While at the center, masks must be worn at all times, except when at your seated at your table.
- Plexiglass shields will be installed in the reception areas and staff areas for additional protection. We ask that you not enter the staff cubicles and offices, unless invited by the staff member.
- Signs will be posted throughout the Center in regards to hygiene and social distancing. Please review these and follow all recommendations.
- Tables and chairs will be arranged according to social distancing guidelines. Please do not move any tables and chairs.
- Please do not enter the kitchen/dietary area.
- Everyone must remain on the first floor or the basement for specific activities. Only 2 people on the elevator at a time.
- Only one person in each restroom at a time.
- Coffee, tea, and ala carte will not be available at this time.
- Certain activities will not be available at this time.
- Reservations are required for congregate meals and all activities (by 1pm on the prior business day) with 24-hour cancellation notice. Honesdale: 570-253-5540, Hamlin: 570-689-3766, Hawley: 570-226-4209
- Participants must sanitize shared equipment in between each use.
- Sanitizing Wipes and hand sanitizing stations will be available throughout each center.
- Our maintenance staff will continue to thoroughly clean and sanitize all areas throughout the day.
- The card room/library at the Honesdale Senior Center will not be available until further notice.
- Each room has a capacity limit that will be posted. This capacity limit includes staff, participants, and volunteers.
- Any staff, volunteer or participant who is exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 (fever 100+, shortness of breath/difficulty breathing, diarrhea, chills/shaking, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste/smell), has been in recent contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, or traveled outside of the country within the past 14 days are asked not to enter the Center.

If you need to meet with a member of our staff to discuss services or assistance with applications, etc., please make an appointment.







APPRISE

Greetings to everyone from the APPRISE staff. We hope everyone is staying safe and following the recommended guidelines. We continue to assist clients by phone and mail, but we do realize that adds to the confusion, especially when dealing with Medicare. For those who are turning 65, Social Security is the first step. If you are working and covered by a group health insurance and will continue working, you do not have to do anything. This pertains to employers with more than 20 workers. If you are not covered through employment or retiring, you will need to apply for Medicare A + B. Even if you have a retiree health plan that provides great coverage, if you are not "actively" working, you will receive a penalty when you do apply. The penalty is 10% for every 12 months that you do not have Medicare and would be based on the current rate of \$144.60 for the Part B premium. PART A is free and covers hospitalization. PART B covers the majority of services outside of a hospital stay, such as testing, lab work and outpatient procedures. Medicare covers at 80% and plans are available to pick up to remaining 20% and deductibles. A drug plan is also required and the penalty for not joining a drug plan is 1% for every month without it.


