

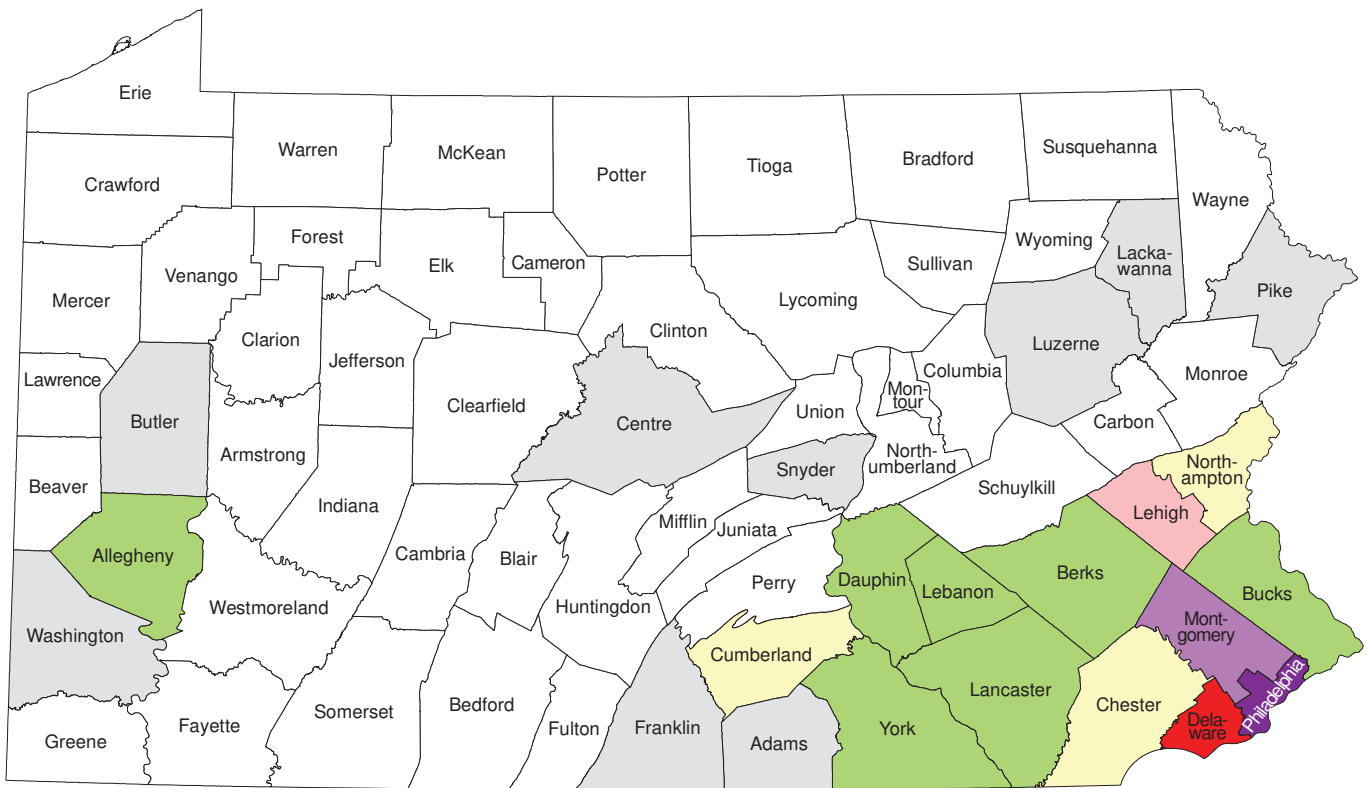

POPULATION DENSITY CHANGE IN PENNSYLVANIA COUNTIES

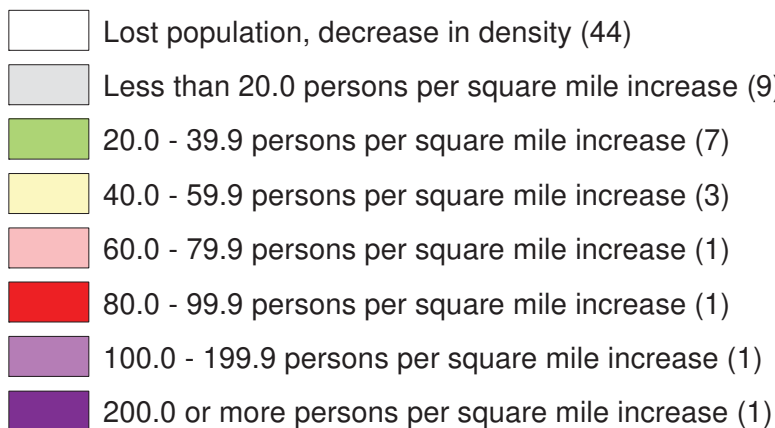

Population Density Change in Pennsylvania Counties 2010-2020



Between 2010 and 2020 the U.S. Census Bureau estimates Pennsylvania's population density increased 6.7 persons per square mile. During that time, a total of 23 counties are estimated to have increased in population while 44 counties decreased.

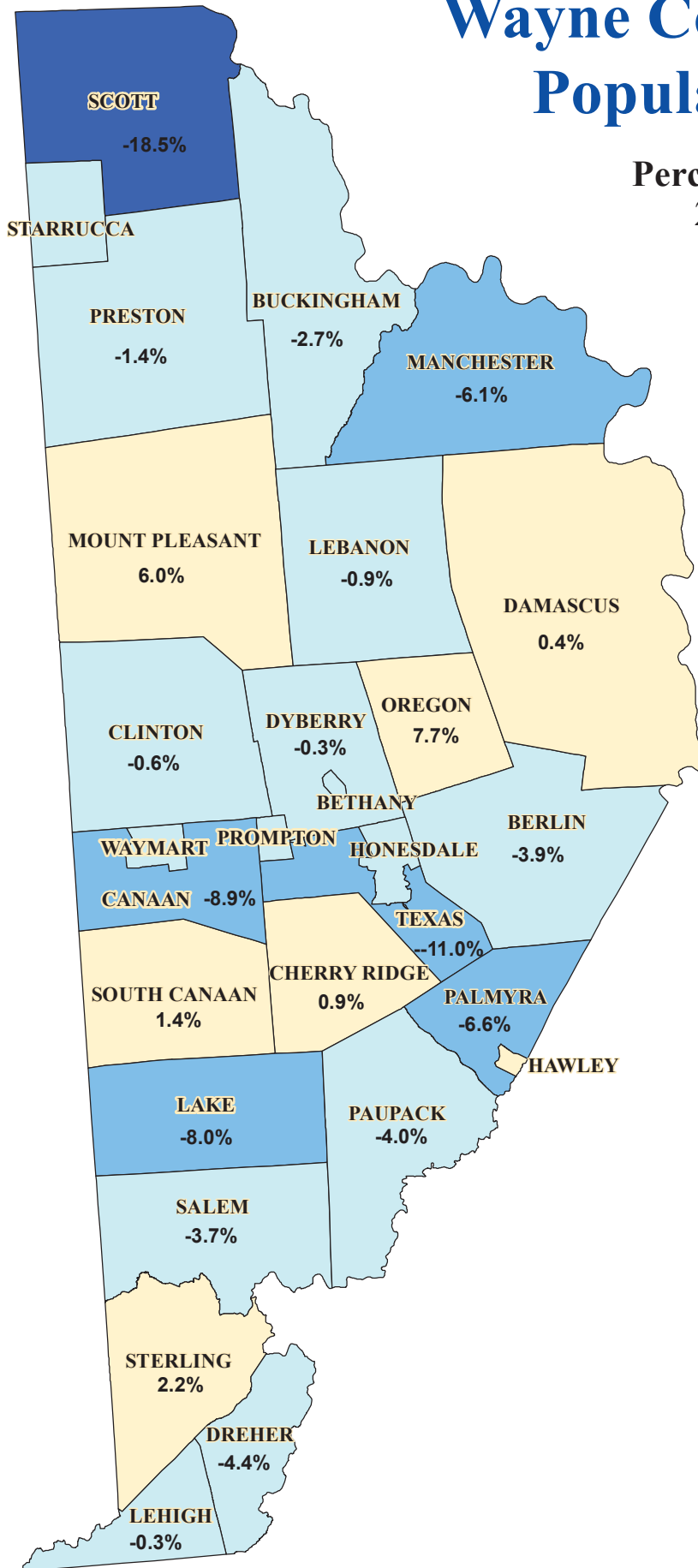

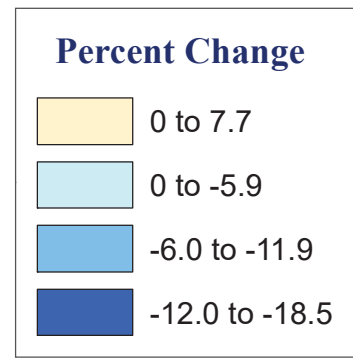

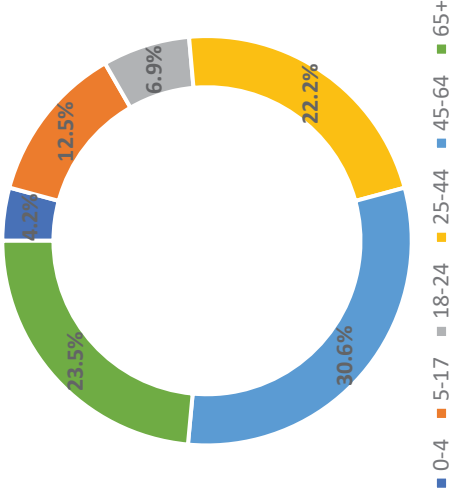

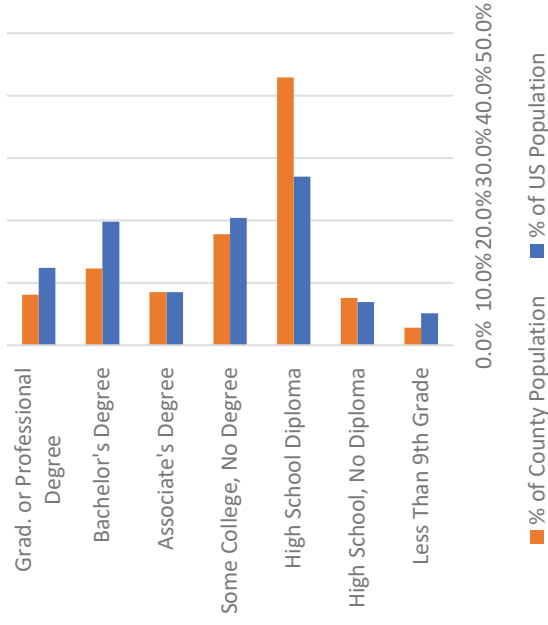
