

March 27, 2019
Clinton Township Board of Supervisors Meeting

A special meeting of the Clinton Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chair Coles on March 27, 2019 at 7:00 PM at the Clinton Township municipal building for the purpose of opening bids for grading and rolling township roads as well as discussion of the purchase of a new township truck. Chair Coles, Vice Chair Brian Non and Supervisor Russell Curtis were present.

A. Pledge of Allegiance

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

B. Hearing Check / Meeting is audio and visually recorded

C. Open Issues

- a. **New truck for Clinton Township** – Vice Chair Non explained that a new truck itself would cost \$106,666 and outfitting the body for township use along with a plow will cost an additional \$69,603. This would cost the township yearly payments of \$25,000. Vice Chair Non then pointed out that the township pays roughly \$3,000 a month for snow plowing Browndale in winter. Supervisor Curtis voiced the opinion that the township should save money, pick up a used grader and throw a plow on it, as we pay off the other vehicles. It was noted that while we do pay Kilpatrick roughly \$20,000 per year for Browndale, the mountain, Brace Brook Rd, and Maple have also been added to what is expected from his plowing service. Chair Coles closed the subject stating that he wants to think about the issue.
- b. **Bids for Grading/Rolling** – Bids were opened, with the results as follows:

Vice Chair Non made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Curtis to accept the low bid submitted by E. R. Linde and that the job should be done in four weeks, weather permitting. All voted yes. The motion carried.

- c. Chair Coles made a motion, seconded by Vice Chair Non to keep the township website for general information only and to not publish minutes, permits, or the budget.

F. Adjournment – Vice Chair Non made a motion, seconded by Chair Coles to adjourn the meeting at 7:58 p.m. All voted yes. The motion carried.
